NOTE: Curriculum worksheets are supplemental planning aids. Every effort is made to ensure accuracy; however, it is the student's responsibility to understand and meet degree requirements as stated in the applicable Undergraduate Catalog. Pre-Business is not a degree-granting program. All Pre-business students must complete the Pre-Business freshman core and have a cumulative grade-point average of *2.0 or better before* being admitted into the Financial Management major. Registration for 3000-and 4000-level business courses may be restricted to students in their degree major, so students should endeavor to complete the core requirements and declare Finance a major as soon as possible.

To comply with the South Carolina REACH ACT, all undergraduate students who enter the university during summer 2021 or after must pass one of the following courses HIST 1010, POSC 1010, or POSC 1030.
