Pre-Nursing Worksheet for Students Entering Fall 2021

I. Admission Requirements:

- A. High School graduate or high school equivalency (GED/HiSET/TASC) transcript <u>MUST</u> be on file (foreign transcripts must be evaluated by ECE or WES and contain the statement "has the equivalent of a US high school diploma").
- B. All applicants <u>MUST</u> take the Kaplan Test Prep: Applicants must test only on designated Kaplan Test Prep Exam dates (see Nursing Application for a list of exam dates). Applicants are allowed one test attempt per application cycle. Score will be valid for 2 years from date of administration. Must achieve a minimum composite score of 50% per section. Exam consists of Reading, Math, Writing, and Science.
- C. Complete 10 semester hours of college credit: BIO 203 (4), PSY 101 (3), ENG 101 (3).
- D. All applicants <u>MUST</u> attend a Nursing Information Session during the current application cycle. <u>Prior year attendance DOES NOT count</u> (see Nursing Application for a list of dates).
- II. Special Notes:
 - A. Current CPR certification must be completed prior to the start of the Nursing program through the <u>AMERICAN HEART</u> <u>ASSOCIATION CPR course</u>. The card <u>must</u> read "<u>BASIC LIFE SUPPORT PROVIDER</u>" and will be valid for a 2-year period. Red Cross certification is <u>NOT</u> acceptable. CPR certification is a program requirement, not an admissions requirement.
 - B. Since nursing applications are reviewed in June, all admission requirements must be completed by the end of the spring 2021 semester. MEETING THESE MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS <u>DOES NOT</u> GUARANTEE ADMISSION TO THE NURSING PROGRAM. The number of students that can be accommodated in this program is limited.
