## **EXTRA CREDIT: NOTE READING SKILLS**

Here are the same four measures to Yankee Doodle which you copied several months ago. Now let's put names to the notes. There are only 4 different notes in these measures, and we'll give the first one away: it's an F. Remember that the musical alphabet only goes from A - G, so if a note comes immediately after a G, it must be an A, because the letters start over again. If you move from a space to the very next line (up or down), that is one "step" or letter name. If you move from a line to the very next space, that is also one "step."
