	Leave If you're ever around a friend who wants to play with a gun, <i>leave</i> the area immediately and tell an adult. When kids play with guns, it's often other kids nearby who end up getting shot!	1. <u>Leave</u> 2
	Spark A bullet is the projectile that fires from the gun. Many kids don't realize that bullets can be dangerous even without a gun. If a bullet is held to a heat source or struck in a way that makes a spark, a bullet can fire all on its own!	4
	Shoot Guns can sometimes accidentally discharge, which means they <i>shoot</i> without someone pulling the trigger. Sometimes this happens if they are bumped against something, or if the trigger snags on clothing. Just another reason you should never handle a gun: they are dangerous!	4
