Entrepreneurship is many things to many people. A leading scholar in the field, William Bygrave, defines it as "...initiative, imagination, flexibility, creativity, and a willingness to think conceptually, and the capacity to see change as an opportunity." - Lee Business School's Course-Repeat Policy: Students may take business courses a maximum of three times for degree applicability.
- Students should apply for graduation at least two semesters prior to their expected graduation date. Please see MyUNLV to initiate graduation and speak with your advisor about eligibility.
